**Keynote Speech: Marshall Forstein, MD**

**Director of Training, Division of Adult Psychiatry, The Cambridge Hospital; Associate Professor of Psychiatry, Harvard Medical School**

**Working with gay men in the post ARV era** - Dr. Forstein is currently Chairing the Steering Committee on HIV Education and Training in the American Psychiatric Institute for Research and Education of the American Psychiatric Association. He has been a principle investigator on an HIV Education and Training Grant through the federal Center for Mental Health Services, teaches and has published on the neuropsychiatry and psychosocial aspects of the HIV/AIDS epidemic. He is a Distinguished Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and is currently serving on the Residency Review Committee for Psychiatry of The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. He is a core faculty member in the Division of Palliative Care at Harvard Medical School.

**Women's Health and HIV/AIDS: Julie Maggi, MD, MSc, FRCPC**  
**Psychiatrist, HIV Psychiatry Program, St. Michael's Hospital & Mental Health in Medicine Program, Women's College Hospital; Assistant Professor, U of T**

Dr. Maggi's work focuses on the mental health needs of women living with HIV, particularly the needs of immigrant women from countries where HIV is endemic. These women may face particular challenges in navigating Canadian health systems. Dr. Maggi is currently a co-principle investigator on a study of the community support services available to women living with HIV. She is also part of a community-university research partnership led by Dr. Alan Li examining the mental health needs of immigrants, refugees and people without status who have HIV; and is working with Dr. Mona Loutfy to understand and support the pregnancy planning needs of women living with HIV.
