



The Casey Awards

Created in tribute to June Callwood, The Casey Awards annually celebrate individuals and organizations across Canada who demonstrate leadership in social justice and commitment to HIV/AIDS. Created in 2008, the inaugural recipient, and inspiration, for the awards was June Callwood, one of the founders of Casey House. The Casey Awards celebrate June's spirit of innovative leadership.

The awards are presented at the Casey House annual meeting, taking place June 18, 2019.

Nomination Outline

The Casey Awards committee has an open call for nominations for the 2019 Casey Awards. Nominations are encouraged from the entire community and self-nominations are welcome.

Nominated individuals are reviewed and evaluated by a committee comprised of members of the Casey House board of directors, volunteers, staff and community representatives.

Nomination deadline

Friday May 17, 2019 at 5 p.m.

Categories

The Casey Awards categories are:

- Leadership and social justice in HIV/AIDS by an individual
- Leadership and social justice in HIV/AIDS by a group or community organization
- Leadership and social justice in HIV/AIDS by a corporation or foundation
- Leadership and social justice in HIV/AIDS by a philanthropist

Evaluation Criteria

Casey Award nominations will be evaluated by the committee, who will base their final and binding decisions on a variety of factors, including:

- Exceptional service to, or collaboration with, the broader community
- Support to Casey House as well as the broader community
- Demonstrate values that align with Casey House
- Demonstrate leadership
- Longevity of service to the community

The Casey Awards committee shall determine, based on the evaluation criteria and nominations received whether to present an award in any or all of the categories.

Awards Category Details

Leadership in HIV/AIDS or social justice by an individual

To recognize Canadian individuals whose dedicated activism, volunteerism, leadership and compassion has made our world a better and more humane place.

Leadership in HIV/AIDS or social justice by a group or community organization

To recognize Canadian groups or community organizations whose dedicated activism, volunteerism, leadership and compassion has made our world a better and more humane place.

Leadership in HIV/AIDS or social justice by a corporation or foundation

Presented to a corporation or corporate or private foundation or special-purpose philanthropic group that has demonstrated outstanding commitment to both Casey House and the broader community, through leadership, volunteerism, community building and financial support as well as through encouragement and motivation of others to take leadership roles in supporting stronger communities.

Leadership in HIV/AIDS or social justice by a philanthropist

In recognition of an individual or family who has demonstrated outstanding civic and philanthropic leadership through a proven record of exceptional leadership, generosity of spirit and financial support of Casey House and within the HIV/AIDS community. Winners will have motivated others to take leadership roles toward philanthropy in our community or at a broader provincial or national level.

Nomination Process

Nominations should include the name, address and contact information for both the nominee and the nominator. There should be a brief narrative description of the nominee's accomplishments and why they should be considered for The Casey Awards. There should be a list of examples of the nominee's contributions to the broader community and up to three letters of support from individuals or organizations for the nomination.
